NEW BERLIN SAFETY COMMISSION MINUTES

Wednesday, Sept. 12, 2001 7:30 p.m.

Meeting called to order: Called to order at 7:35 p.m. by Chairman Jim Polczynski

Approval of Minutes: Motion by Bill Dunn to approve the minutes from August 8, 2001.

Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously.

Old Business:

02 01 08 Bill Dunn and Jack Chiovatero both advised they checked into the concern over the timing of turn arrows at Moorland and Cleveland and neither found any problem.

Motion by Bill Dunn to refer the concern to Waukesha County and drop this item from the agenda. Seconded by Deb Schenk and carried unanimously.

03 01 08 Bill Dunn and Jack Chiovatero advised there is a hazard and safety concern over trucks and equipment being parked on the street in front of the business, Wisconsin Logistics, in the 5000 block of Emmer Drive.

Motion by Ron Schildt to direct the street department to remove existing street signs posted outside Wisconsin Logistics. The street signs are not legally posted. Seconded by Bill Dunn and carried unanimously. Motion by Bill Dunn to have the council modify an existing ordinance to have all industrial parks in the city have no parking signs posted on streets. Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously. Hold on agenda until signs are posted.

04 01 08 Bill Dunn advised that signs for the industrial park and Small Rd. have been put up on Moorland. This addresses concerns regarding directions to Westridge.

Motion by Bill Dunn to drop this item from the agenda. Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously.

Tabled Items:

03 00 06 Dan Hanlon updated members on Keep Kids Alive. The signs are to be returned at the end of September. Overall, the campaign was a success and it will be done again next year. (Revisited) (Tabled 10/11/00)

04 01 07 Motion by Jack Chiovatero made a motion to remove this item from tabled to discuss it. Seconded by Bill Dunn and carried unanimously.

Jack Chiovero stated additional concern over intersection safety at Wilbur and Cottonwood has come from calls from irate citizens. It was learned that a barrier was removed in the area which has contributed to more traffic and additional safety concerns.

Motion by Jack Chiovero made a motion to put up a two way arrow at this intersection and remove signage noting that it is a curve. Seconded by Ron Schildt and carried unanimously. Item to remain on agenda until signs are in place.

03 01 06 Fence atop retaining wall at Moorland and Howard.

Motion by Jack Chiovero to table this item and keep on agenda until fence is in place. Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously.

New Business:

01 01 09 Jack Chiovero advised that the Council has been getting calls regarding Coyote concerns. Jack Chiovero introduced a citizen, Rob Goodell. Goodell stated he has seen many Coyotes in the city and is concerned about the safety of pets and children. Goodell offered his experience as a sharpshooter if such a service is adopted. Discussion centered on the policies of other cities. Dan Hanlon will check with other communities regarding policies and have results for next month's meeting. Bill Dunn offered to contact the DNR regarding this problem. Hold on agenda.

02 02 09 Request for stop or yield signs at the intersection of Riviera and Eldorado. Ron Schildt advised that traffic surveys of Riviera and Eldorado reveal very few vehicles on any given day. Ron Schildt also advised there has been one (1) accident at the intersection since 1999. Hold on agenda for further review.

Motion by Jim Polczynski to adjourn the meeting at 8:25 p.m. Seconded by Deb Schenk and carried unanimously.
